Hours of Operation:

The PANP Townsite Office is open 8:00am -12:00pm and 12:30pm – 4:00 pm Monday through Friday.

Cottage Dates 2006:

As per your lease agreement, cottage owners are permitted to occupy the land from April 1 – October 31.

Weather will dictate when water lines will be opened. Our utilities crew will work hard to ensure lines are open as soon as possible.

Development off site:

If you are planning on developing off site, please contact the park office for information on the restrictions in the cottage area.

Building moving is as follows:

- Before the May long weekend
- After September 4th

Between May 23rd and June 16th, buildings may be moved Monday-Thursday

Buildings may not be moved:

- On the May long weekend (May 19-22)
- June 16th - September 4th

Construction Waste:

Cottage owners are responsible to have construction waste removed from PANP. This is a condition of all Environmental Assessments that cottage owners sign prior to construction. Construction waste includes discarded household appliances. Please make the necessary arrangements to have construction waste removed to an approved landfill location. Parks Canada is not responsible for the disposal of construction waste generated by cottage construction.

Building Permits:

Cottage owners are reminded that permits are required for all construction work on their cottages. This includes, but is not limited to: Siding, shingles, decks, exterior painting, sheds, etc.

Please see the Townsite office to obtain permits.

Garbage and Recycling

There is a composting bin at the **recycling depot** located in the parking lot next to the post office. This bin is for vegetable waste including eggshells and coffee grounds. This bin is **not** intended for animal parts or by-products or dairy products. Plastic will not decompose in the bin. Please do not throw bags or pails in with your compost. This bin is emptied at the park staging area and mixed with other organic material to form a rich brown soil that is available to the public. Please call 663-4549 for information about when/where to get compost.

Boat/Trailer Parking

Cottage owners are reminded that boats and trailers are to be stored in an approved location (your cottage lot or at storage facilities provided by the marina) and not on public streets, green space or public easements. Boats and trailers stored on public streets, green space and easements impede sight lines and cause congestion; they are a public safety hazard.

Managing Wildlife in Waskesiu

Bears are drawn to food and garbage. Bears that become habituated to humans and their garbage are more often than not destroyed through no fault of their own. Please:

Pick up garbage and dispose of it properly
Do not leave food unattended outside
Proper food and garbage storage greatly reduces human/bear conflict.

Elk give elk the space they need by staying at least 30 metres away. Females are most aggressive during the May/June calving season and males are especially dangerous during the September/October rut. Please be careful in area frequented by elk and keep an eye out for areas posted with caution signs.

Emergency Contact Numbers:

Contact the RCMP at 663-4400 for all law enforcement matters involving public peace: alcohol-related offences, highway traffic offences, theft and vandalism.

Contact Park Wardens at 663-4532 for all matters involving protection of the park's natural resources (wildlife, fisheries, vegetation, wildfire, food/garbage left unattended). Park wardens are also the first contact for missing or overdue persons.
