The following fact sheet is intended to provide you with answers to your questions and to help answer questions you may receive from visitors to Prince Albert National Park.

Visitor Survey – Summer 2007

1. Every 5 years, each national park and historic site must conduct entrance surveys with people travelling to our parks/sites to learn more about patterns of visitor experience and activities. Findings will help Parks Canada align visitor facilities and opportunities with visitor use patterns. 2007 is the year for Prince Albert.
2. The survey will compile information regarding visitor demographics, activities, and levels of satisfaction with participant's experiences.
3. Park staff will conduct the surveys with visitors at 'intercept locations' seven days a week until mid-October, 2007. Intercept locations will be at the East Gate and the South Gate.
4. The intercept survey takes approximately 5 minutes to complete and participation is voluntary. Visitors are then asked if they would take the time to complete a more thorough questionnaire regarding their use patterns and activities while in the park.
5. Counters will be installed on various trails to record pedestrian, cycling and horseback use.
6. In addition, Cookson Road traffic will be surveyed to gather use patterns. Counters will be installed at various locations along the road to gather vehicle statistics.
7. Participants are asked to provide contact information that will be used for potential follow-up in the Fall 2007/Winter 2008 season. Findings of the survey will be made available in 2008.
