## **BOUNDARY BOG TRAIL REVITALIZATION PROJECT BEGINS ON TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 6, 2022**

**Waskesiu Lake, Saskatchewan, September 6, 2022** – Parks Canada is preparing for construction on the popular Boundary Bog trail in Prince Albert National Park. The Boundary Bog trailhead and parking lot will be closed to the public during construction beginning September 6, 2022 through December 2022. The project will resume and be completed in fall 2023.

The Boundary Bog revitalization project increases accessibility, safety and enjoyment for all visitors by creating an expanded boardwalk. The existing trail boardwalk is at the end of its lifecycle. The expanded boardwalk will float, which reduces the effect of frost heave that created the uneven conditions on the current boardwalk while minimizing environmental impact. Prince Albert National Park and Indigenous peoples worked together to develop interpretive materials for the Boundary Bog trail with the goal of fostering a better understanding of Indigenous peoples' perspectives, cultures and traditions.

Boundary Bog is a popular, two kilometer trail that brings park visitors into the rarely-seen world of the black spruce fen with its carnivorous plants, dwarf birch and golden tamarack. The park maintains a number of easy and moderate hiking trails close to the Waskesiu townsite, including the Waskesiu River trail, Mud Creek trail and Shady Lake trail, where families can enjoy the fall colours and the changing of the seasons.

As cornerstones of Canada's tourism industry, Parks Canada administered places are committed to providing visitors with high quality and meaningful experiences across the country, through collaboration with Indigenous partners. Investments in visitor infrastructure such as the Boundary Bog trail will ensure the quality and reliability of visitor facilities and continue to allow Canadians to connect with nature.
