## Life-Threatening (Emergency) Situations on the Water

- 1. Safety on the water for you and your guests is <u>your</u> responsibility. Visitors should be self reliant when visiting Prince Albert National Park.
- 2. In the event of any life-threatening (emergency) situation on the water, call Parks Canada Dispatch at 1 877 852 3100. Response times may vary.
- 3. Parks Canada rescuers prioritize your <u>personal</u> safety. You are responsible for the safe return of your watercraft and equipment.

## Watercraft Retrieval (Non-Emergency Situations)

- 1. Ensuring the safe return of your watercraft is <u>your</u> responsibility. Visitors should be self reliant when visiting Prince Albert National Park.
- 2. Before you leave, always be prepared for the unexpected. Watercraft operators are often stranded by storms, wind, or waves, and by mechanical breakdowns.
- 3. Always check the weather before heading out and during your trip.
- 4. Prior to heading out on the water, consider the following:
  - a. Have a trip plan and tell your friends or family where you are going, and when you plan to be back.
  - b. Have an emergency contact number to call for assistance.
  - c. Have all required safety equipment on board.
  - d. If your watercraft is motorized, always ensure:
    - It is full of fuel.
    - It has been properly serviced.
    - Your battery is in good condition and fully charged.
- 5. In the event of mechanical failure, lack of fuel, or other non-emergency situations, watercraft towing services are available (for a fee) from Mile 11 Towing in Montreal Lake (Contact 306 961-8038). Response times may vary.
