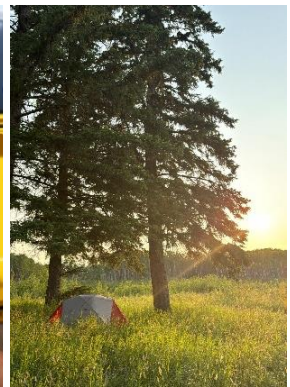

WORK IN PRINCE ALBERT NATIONAL PARK THIS SUMMER!



Are you interested in protecting ecosystems? Do you love being outside? Prince Albert National Park is looking to hire student Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Technicians and Field Technicians this summer.

AIS Technicians will protect park waters by conducting watercraft inspections and decontaminations, increasing public awareness on invasive species, monitoring for aquatic invasives, and assisting with other field work as time allows.

Field Technicians will support Ecologists and Resource Management Officers in wildlife, vegetation, and aquatic monitoring. Wildlife field work will include monitoring colonial nesting birds and songbirds. Vegetation work will include monitoring and removing invasive plants, assessing grassland health, and restoring disturbed areas. Aquatics work will include conducting loon surveys and collecting water quality samples.

Ideal candidates will be self-starters, team players and willing to spend the summer working irregular hours and weekends. Occasional backcountry overnight trips may be required. A valid driver's licence and legal status to work in Canada is a requirement. Training will be provided, but please indicate if you have any of the following experience:

- Using a GPS and compass to navigate in wilderness areas,
- Travelling in the backcountry by various means (hiking, biking, motorboat, or ATV),
- Collecting and entering ecological field data,
- Following protocols and procedures,
- Basic wildland fire training,
- Working as part of a team,
- Working with the public.
